

ORDINANCE NO. 20

An ordinance amending that certain ordinance of the Village of Green Isle known as ordinance No. 17 and entitled as follows: "An ordinance granting permission to Northern States Power Company, its successors and assigns, to erect and maintain in the Village of Green Isle transmission lines and electric distribution system, including necessary pole lines and fixtures for the furnishing of current to the Village and its inhabitants, and of transmitting current into and through the Village, and prescribing maximum rates therefor, and to use the streets, alleys, and public ground of said Village for such purposes," as subsequently amended.

The Village Council of Green Isle do ordain as follows:

Section 1. That Section 4 of that certain ordinance of the Village of Green Isle, Minnesota, known as ordinance No. 17 bearing date October 2nd, 1916, and entitled as follows:

"An Ordinance granting permission to Northern States Power Company, its successors and assigns, to erect and maintain in the Village of Green Isle transmission lines and electric distribution system, including necessary pole lines and fixtures for the furnishing of current to the Village and inhabitants, and of transmitting current into the Village, and prescribing maximum rates therefore, and to use the streets, alleys and public grounds of said Village for such purposes,"

as subsequently amended by Ordinance No. 18 passed Oct. 17, 1916, be and the same hereby is amended so as to read as follows, to wit:

Section 1. In case said grantee, its successors or assigns, shall not on or before Jan. 1st, 1918, be ready and able to furnish electric current to said Village or the inhabitants thereof, then this ordinance, together with all rights and privileges hereby granted, may, at the election of the Council be declared null and void.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication as provided by law.
