SEC. 2.—Any person liable to perform such labor as provided in Section One (1) of this ordinance may commute such labor by paying to the Street Commissioner or such other officer duly authorized to receive the same the sum of One Dollar and Fifty cents (\$1.50) for each day so required to be performed in labor, which said payment shall be a full discharge from all liability to perform such labor for that year.

SEC. 3.—The Village Recorder shall make a list of the names of all persons in said Village as far as may be known to him who are liable to perform labor on the streets, avenues and roads as provided in Section One (1) of this ordinance and attach thereto a warrant signed by the President of the Council attested by the Recorder, directing the street commissioner to cause the persons whose names appear on said list and such other persons as he may find residing in said Village of Green Isle, to labor two days or commute such labor by paying Three Dollars (\$3.00).

SEC. 4.—The street commissioner is hereby required to give three days notice to all persons liable to perform labor under this ordinance of the time and place when and where their services will be required and what tools they are required to furnish with which to perform such labor as required by Section One (1) of this ordinance, or to commute as required by Section Two (2), it shall be the duty of the Street Commissioner to prosecute any person or persons who may neglect or refuse to labor or commute for the penalty as provided by law under the general statutes and upon conviction and neglect to pay the fine and costs, the defendant shall be committed to the Village or County Jail until such fine and costs are paid, not exceeding three (3) days and the street commissioner is hereby authorized to receive money in commutation of said labor as required by this ordinance.

SEC. 5.—Any person who shall obstruct any of the public streets, avenues, sidewalks or roads within the corporate limits of said village by piling wood, lumber or other material, or building fences or buildings thereon or by preventing the free use thereof by the public in any manner whatever shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in a sum not less than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) nor more than Fifty Dollars (\$50) with the cost of prosecution for each and every offense and be committed to the village or county jail until fine and costs are paid, not exceeding twenty-five (25) days, provided however, that the council may grant permits for the use of limited space on said streets, avenues or roads for placing building material for the erection of buildings or such other purposes as they may deem expedient and for a period not exceeding sixty (60) days unless said permit be renewed.

SEC. 6.—Whenever it shall come to the knowledge of the street commissioner that any street, avenue, road or sidewalk is obstructed in any manner as in Section five (5) of this ordinance said street commissioner shall notify the owner thereof, if known to him, to remove the obstruction immediately and in case of his neglect or refusal to do so it shall be the duty of the street commissioner to call out any or all persons liable to work poll tax sufficient to remove said obstructions and to immediately remove the same.

SEC. 7.—Any person working on the streets, avenues or roads as aforesaid, shall be entitled to the same compensation as if warned to work out his poll tax and the street commissioner shall give him a receipt stating the amount and the length of time he has worked, which shall apply on his present or succeeding year's poll tax.

SEC. 8.—The cost of removal of such obstruction shall become a lien upon the property of the owners thereof or upon the property of the persons placing the same in the streets, avenues or highways, or upon the sidewalks and shall be collected in the following manner in case the obstruction consists of any material which is valuable the street commissioner after the removal of the same shall report to the Council the cost of such removal, whereupon it shall be the duty of the Council to order the Village Constable to sell the same or so much thereof as may be necessary to realize the cost of said removal together with the cost of sale, upon giving ten (10) days notice of such sale by describing the property to be sold and giving the name of the owner thereof, if known, by posting notices of such sale in three (3) of the most public places in the village, giving the time and place of such sale and the amount to be realized.

SEC. 9.—The amount so realized shall become a part of the fund for the repair of the streets after deducting the Constable's fees and shall be paid to the Village Treasurer.

SEC. 10.—If the property or obstruction so removed by the street commissioner is not of sufficient value to pay for the removal of the same, then the cost of such removal shall become a charge against the property, both real and personal, of the person or persons owning or placing the same upon such streets, avenues or highways and the amount thereof shall be added to the personal property tax next to be extended on the list of personal property or against any real estate he may own and collected as other taxes.

SEC. 11.—This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
