AN ORDINANCE LICENSING AND REGULATING THE SALE OF  
INTOXICATING LIQUOR REPEALING INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES  
AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.  
The Council of the Village of Green Isle do ordain as  
follows:

Section 1.

It shall be unlawful for any person to sell intoxicating liquors containing more than 3.2 per cent alcohol by volume either on-sale or off-sale in the Village of Green Isle, Sibley County, Minnesota without first having obtained a license so to do as hereinafter provided. There shall be two kinds of licenses, viz:

A. On-sale license shall permit the licensee to sell such intoxicating liquors for consumption on the licensed premises, the license fee therefor shall be two hundred dollars per annum. Not more than two on-sale licenses shall be granted to persons applying therefor in the Village of Green Isle,

B. Off-sale license shall permit the licensee to sell intoxicating liquors in original packages for consumption off the premises only. The license fee for off-sale shall be ~~one hundred~~ dollars per annum.

Section 2.

Any person desiring either an on-sale or off-sale license shall file with the Village Clerk, his application in writing, and his Certified Check of amount of license fee, describing the premises for which the license is desired.

Section 3.

It shall be unlawful to sell any intoxicating liquor to any person under 21 years of age, an habitual drunkard, to any intoxicated person or to any person of Indian blood.

Section 4.

No sale of intoxicating liquor shall be made on Sunday nor before 3 o'clock P. M., on any Memorial Day, nor before 8 o'clock P. M., on any election day in said village. No on-sale shall be made before 8 o'clock A. M., or after 11 o'clock midnight of any day. No off-sale shall be made before 8 o'clock a. m., or after 8 o'clock p. m., of any day except Saturday, on which day off-sales may be made until 10 o'clock p. m.

Any license granted under this Ordinance may be revoked by the council without notice to the grantee and a hearing shall first be held by the council and revocation then made for cause. Any violation of any provision or condition of this ordinance shall be ground for revocation.

Section 5.

No person holding either on-sale or off-sale license will be permitted to serve meals to the public. No person holding either on-sale or off-sale license will be permitted to have pool tables, card tables or slot machines in premises described in application for license.
